



Goals and Outcomes

- Based on international best practice, assess the capacity of UAE educational publishers in meeting the current needs of the Ministry of Education and identify gaps for which capacity development, enhanced cooperation, or trust building could be required
- Expose participants to international best practices on how educational publishers translate national curricula into educational solutions and how these solutions are implemented by teachers in the classroom
- Contextualize international best practices to the UAE to enhance cooperation and feedback loops between the Ministry, teachers and educational publishers
- Identify quick-wins where the Ministry of Education and educational publishers can cooperate to build trust, demonstrate the educational publishing industry's abilities, and replace imported solutions which lack local context
- Develop a 5 year roadmap to transform the UAE educational publishing sector to fully support the Ministry of Education's aspirations with mutually agreed timelines and objectives




